Full-day adventure for fun and learning with the whole family

Family course

Start around Shin-Shizuoka Station!

Shizuoka City Museum of History
(8-min walk from Shin-Shizuoka Sta.)

Experience a look into the past with the remnants of roads ruled by Ieyasu!

You will find a local café on the first floor where you can unwind afterwards.

From Shin-Shizuoka Sta. to Shin-Shimizu Sta.
23-min ride on the Shizutetsu train

S-PULSE DREAM PLAZA

(Approx. 15-min walk or free shuttle bus from Shin-Shimizu Sta. area)

Enjoy lunch at one of the restaurants in S-PULSE DREAM PLAZA, with plenty of options to enjoy local Shizuoka food. Complete with many restaurants offering a children's menu, "Chibi Maruko-chan Land" in S-PULSE DREAM PLAZA is a must-visit!

After eating, take a spin on the merry-go-round or catch a panoramic view of Shimizu Port from the Ferris wheel! You may even catch a glimpse of an event being held on the deck.

Take the Nihondaira Ropeway to Kunoan Toshogu Shrine, where Lord Ieyasu rests

National Treasure: Kunoan Toshogu Shrine

The first shrine dedicated to Lord Ieyasu

After the death of Lord Tokugawa Ieyasu, his remains were buried at Kunoan according to his will, and his successor and the second Shogun, Lord Tokugawa Hidetada ordered this shrine to be built. The shrine buildings, featuring gongen-zukuri architecture, entirely lacquered surfaces, and a dazzling variety of bright colors, have been designated as a National Treasure, as representative architecture of the early Edo period.

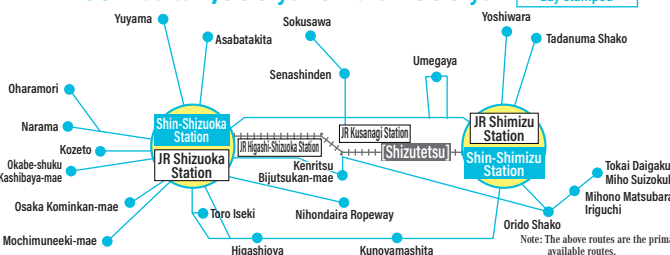

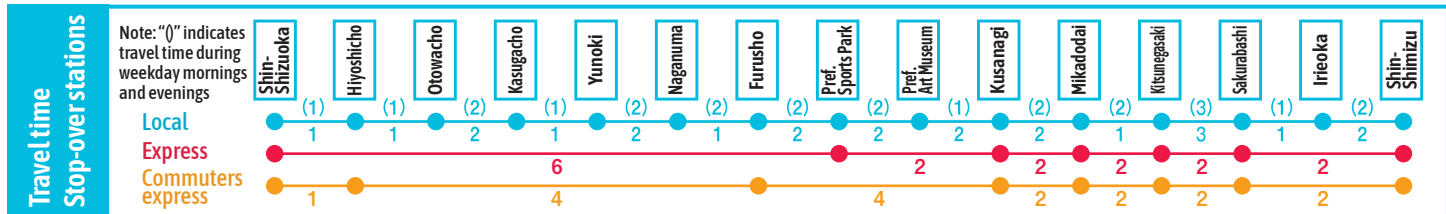
You can freely explore the major tourist spots in the Shizuoka and Shimizu areas at a great value!

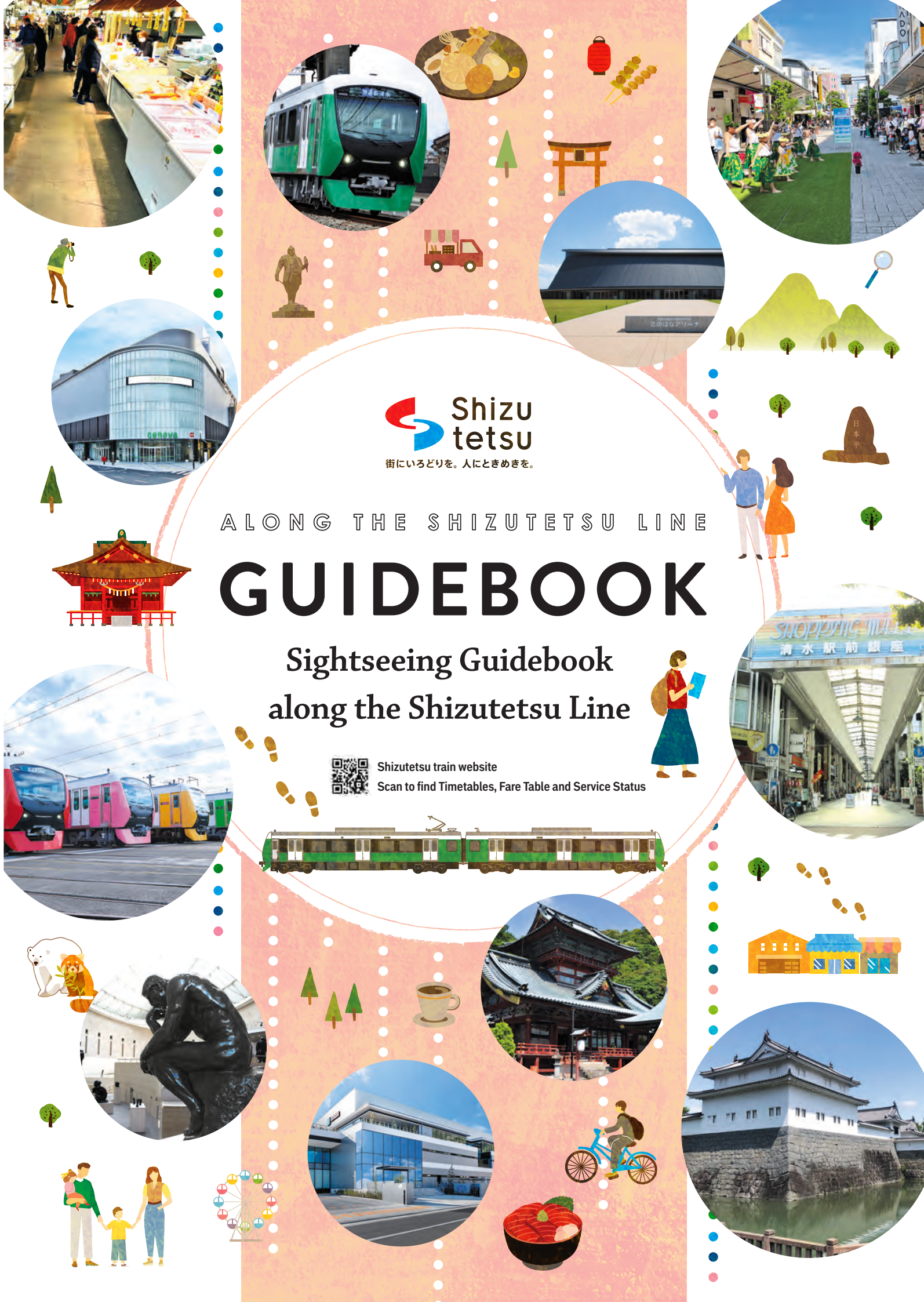

① Sunpu Castle Park / Sunpu Castle ruins



An urban park with great nature throughout the seasons
The site of Lord Tokugawa Ieyasu's castle now serves as a lush green park, a place of relaxation for citizens. The Higashi Gomon (east gate), Tatsumi Yagura tower, and Hitsujiyama Yagura tower have been restored in Sunpu Castle's Ninomaru (center moat), conveying the castle's former appearance.

④ Shizuoka Gofukucho shopping street



"Gofukucho-dori," Shizuoka City's major downtown area
Beloved as "Gofukucho-dori," this bustling downtown area of Shizuoka is lined with numerous stores. In this shopping street where renowned stores stand side by side, you'll find many longtime best sellers. Enjoy the exceptional items crafted by many master artisans.

② Shizuoka City Museum of History



A museum that combines historical exploration, experience, and interaction
Learn about the history of Shizuoka City through valuable materials from Tokugawa Ieyasu and the Imagawa clan, the Tokaido, the Sunpu castle town, the Shizuoka domain in the Meiji period, to the postwar period. The architectural design and the view from the third floor are also must-see.

③ Shizuoka Sengen Shrine



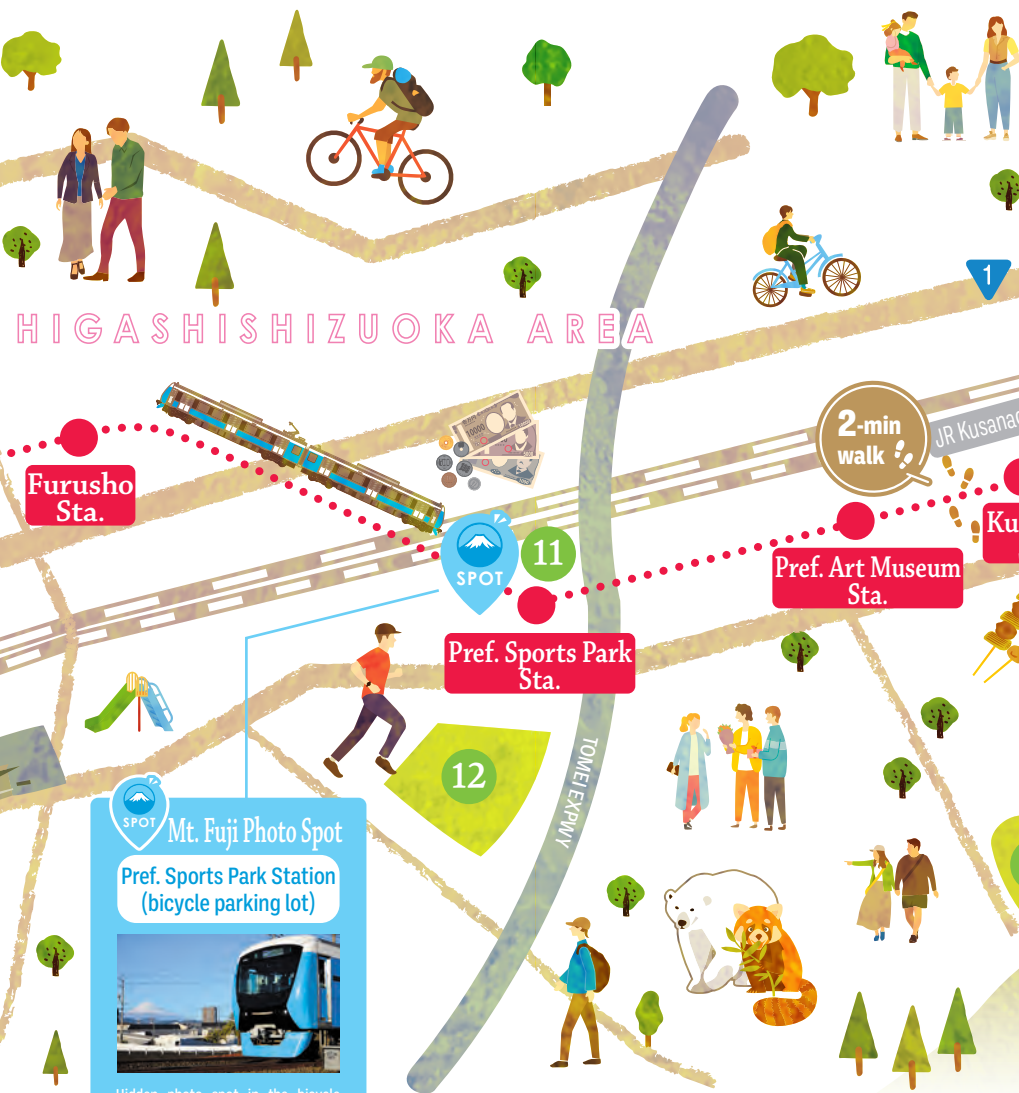
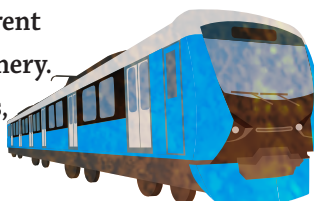
The place where Takechiyo (Lord Ieyasu) came of age
As the principal shrine of Suruga Province, it was revered by successive shoguns, and Lord Ieyasu also deeply honored it so that he constructed the shrine. The group of shrine buildings, designated as a National Important Cultural Property, is also called the "Mikoto of the Tokai" due to its dazzling variety of bright colors.

⑥ SHINSHIZUOKA cenova



Landmark in downtown Shizuoka
About 130 stores are gathered here, for fashion, gourmet food, multiplex cinemas, books, home appliances and more. Directly connected to the train station and bus terminal, you can enjoy shopping conveniently and comfortably.

⑦ Kiyomizu Temple / Kiyomizuyama Park



A place for people of all ages to gather
Kiyomizu Temple was founded by the Imagawa clan. Lord Tokugawa Ieyasu was also a devout believer and presented to the "Aoi" crest. Adjacent Kiyomizuyama Park is an oasis in the city with an artificial waterfall, creating a cool feeling even in summer.

⑧ Shizuoka Gokoku-Jinja Shrine



A healing spot in the quiet temple grounds
Surrounded by lush greenery and boasting spacious grounds, this shrine has enshrined the spirits of Shizuoka natives who dedicated themselves to the nation since the Meiji Restoration. You can also enjoy seasonal flowers such as cherry blossoms and hydrangeas.

⑨ MARK IS Shizuoka



Boasting the largest sales floor area in Shizuoka City
This is the Shizuoka City's largest shopping complex, featuring supermarkets and other grocery stores, stylish fashion and accessory shops, a spacious food court for leisurely dining, and a full lineup of amusement facilities that both adults and children can enjoy.

⑩ BANDAI HOBBY CENTER PLAMO DESIGN INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTE



Production base for plastic models, primarily Gunpla
BANDAI SPIRITS' new plastic model production base began operations in 2025. At the adjoining MUSEUM, you can experience being a "Plastic Model Designer" (Advance reservations required).

⑭ S-PULSE Road



Shimizu, the town of soccer
S-PULSE Road is a 240-meter road extending from the Hinode-cho intersection on ROUTE 149 toward Minato Bridge. Lined with soccer hall monuments and flags on both sides, this road symbolizes Shimizu, the town of soccer.

Enjoy a day out with all family members
With Shimizu Sushi Yokochi, Chibi Maruko-chan Land, movie theaters, and a Ferris wheel, you can enjoy a full day from gourmet dining to shopping at this complex in the bay area. Various events are held throughout the year - check them out!

⑪ National Printing Bureau, Shizuoka Plant



A factory that makes Japan's banknotes
This is the factory of the National Printing Bureau, which prints Japan's banknotes. You can see how banknotes are made. In addition, the factory offers plant tours. Enjoy learning about the anti-counterfeiting technologies used.

⑫ Shizuoka Prefecture Kusanagi Sports Complex



A lush green multi-purpose sports complex
This multi-purpose sports park, featuring a baseball field, track and field stadium, gymnasium and more, is wide open to everyone from professional athletes to sports lovers. This is a great place for health promotion and relaxation.

S09 15-min walk from Pref. Art Museum Sta.

⑬ Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art



Great to stroll through the surroundings too
The museum houses masterpieces by Monet, Gauguin, Yokoyama Taikan, and others. The Rodin Wing features a permanent exhibition of 32 Rodin sculptures, including The Thinker. The Shizuoka Prefectural Central Library is also adjacent.

S10 18-min walk from Kusanagi Sta.

⑭ Kusanagi Jinja Shrine



Let your thoughts go to the age of myth
This shrine, dedicated to Yamato Takeru no Mikoto, has been beloved by successive shoguns, including Lord Ieyasu. Every year on September 20th, the shrine holds its annual Reitaisai festival, launching the prefectural intangible folk-cultural property "Ryusei Fireworks."

⑮ Shimizu Fish Market Kashinoichi



The kitchen of Shimizu Port, representing the city of tuna
You can try fresh seafood like tuna and sakura shrimp, selected by professional wholesalers, at direct sales prices. The new ichibakan had its grand opening in April 2025. Enjoy "port meals" like seafood bowls and tempura bowls.

⑯ Shimizu Ekimae Ginza Shopping Arcade



A shopping arcade popular with both locals and tourists
This large shopping arcade is home to a variety of shops, from traditional to modern and stylish. You can get Shizuoka's famous products and locally produced items. Don't miss particularly popular fresh seafood from Shimizu Port and local agricultural products.

⑰ Shizuoka City Child Creative Town Maaru



Experience jobs through role-play in "Kids Bazaar"
At the Children's Town "Kids Bazaar," children can work at shops run by child store managers, and earn/use wages (play money) to enjoy shopping and games. Event dates: Sat., Sun., and holidays. For elementary school students and older.
